# 2019-2020

Beginning with Summer 2018, College Credit Plus (CCP) students are eligible to enroll in courses from the Hocking College Catalog which meet House Bill 49 requirements, and for which they meet all course prerequisites. The Dynamic Schedule, with course CRNs and Section Numbers may be accessed online.

In compliance with House Bill 49, students must follow the "First 15" Rule and complete 15 credit hours in Level I before progressing to Level II.\*

### Level I Courses may be:

- A transferable course: Part of CTAG, OTM, or TAG or equivalent at private college/university (CTAG: Career-Technical Assurance Guides; OTM: Ohio Transfer Module; TAG: Transfer Assurance Guides)
- Courses in computer science, information technology, anatomy, physiology, or foreign language, including American Sign Language
- Technical certificate course
- 15-credit hour or 30 credit-hour model pathway course
- Study skills, academic or career success skills course
- Internship course
- Another course that may be approved by the Chancellor on an annual basis

\*Exceptions to the "First 15" Rule may be made if the student wishes to continue with courses in the same subject or tests directly into Level II course. Students who have attained the required scores on AP or IB course examinations may count the course toward the First 15.

## **LEVEL II COURSES**

Level II

Any other college course that is not a Level I course.

Additionally, House Bill 49 adds the following non-allowable courses:

- One-on-one private instruction courses
- Course with fees that exceed an amount set by Chancellor
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- P/F or S/U grades (unless the course is an internship or is a transferable course for all students enrolled)
- Remedial courses and sectarian religion courses

Any of these courses are non-allowable unless Chancellor approves for certificate or degree completion (six weeks prior to term request; see rule for details).
